At Hospice Northwest Services, we strive to help our clients make every moment matter by offering comfort, support, and a sense of connection to families and clients facing a life-limiting illness or grieving.

Hospice Northwest Services is a community hospice organization that began in 1986 as the Thunder Bay Community Palliative Care Volunteers. We are honoured to serve approximately 600 end-of-life clients and their loved ones each year.

Hospice Northwest Services is a hospice without walls. We define hospice as a philosophy of care, rather than a place. Our specially trained hospice palliative care volunteers provide emotional and spiritual support to clients and their loved ones in their homes, hospitals, or long-term care facilities.

Hospice Northwest Services is a registered charity, managed by staff and governed by a volunteer Board of Directors.

Hospice Northwest Services is an accredited member of Hospice Palliative Care Ontario (HPCO) and the Canadian Hospice Palliative Care Association. We comply with all current principles of palliative care service, and collaborate with other palliative care providers in Thunder Bay and District to ensure an effective, holistic person-centred approach to client care.

Hospice Northwest serves the City and District of Thunder Bay with support in the communities of Geraldton/Longlac, Terrace Bay/Schreiber, Marathon, Manitouwadge and Nipigon.



In 2025, Hospice Northwest Services provided the following to our community::

- **122** specially trained palliative care volunteers visited clients in Thunder Bay and Region community members
- **5712** one-to-one client visits took place in 2024/25
- **7** specialized hospice volunteer teams provided support
 - Palliative Care Support
 - Grief Client Support
 - Quick Response Team
 - Palliative Advocacy Care Team (PACT)
 - Forget-Me-Not Team
 - Caregiver Support Team
 - Event and administrative volunteers
- **7** Hearts and Hope Grief Group programs were held, with 45 sessions
- **17** Circle of Friends Grief Workshops were hosted, supporting 119 grieving clients
- **48** HUUG (Help Us Understand Grief) Children's Program sessions were held
- **21** 55+ Centre Grief Support Sessions were hosted by Hospice Northwest Services

OUR HISTORY: COMMUNITY PALLIATIVE CARE VOLUNTEERS THUNDER BAY

was incorporated in 1986 by a group of interested volunteers, after a Masters student at Lakehead University did an assessment of palliative care services in Thunder Bay and recommended that a volunteer visiting program be implemented.

- For the first several years, the organization was completely volunteer run
- In 1990, the name Via Vitae (**Life's Way** in Latin) was adopted
- A successful application was made to the United Way for funding, which allowed the organization to hire a part-time Program Coordinator
- In 1994, service expanded to the region to the east of Thunder Bay and funding from the Ministry of Health was secured
- 2001/02: a consultant was hired to advise on a corporate image campaign, and the name Hospice Northwest was adopted
- 2018 saw a refresh of the logo, with warmer colours, a simplified design and a new tagline. The word 'Services' was officially added to our name, to define ourselves as the delivery agent for visiting hospice services rather than a hospice with beds
- Over the years, the number of clients served and volunteers trained has increased substantially. In the first year, 32 clients were supported by 14 trained volunteers
- In 2025, **600+** clients in our various programs received support in Thunder Bay and the region in 2025
- 150 specially trained palliative and grief care volunteers assist those clients
- 8000 people and their families needing end-of-life care and grief support have received Hospice Northwest's services over the past 39 years
- **Hospice Northwest must raise approximately \$300,000** each year in order to continue offering our programs free of charge to our community. Government funding covers approximately 70% of our cost.
